## RECTOR'S REFLECTION

Right now, Nancy and I, along with my son and his girlfriend, are on vacation in Victoria, British Columbia, Canada. We took a train to Toronto from Rochester, then flew to Vancouver Island and are getting around by walking, bus, ferry, and Uber. This is a stunningly beautiful area, with gardens, historic architecture, islands and inlets, and the provincial Capitol campus. We're hearing many different accents and dialects and are sometimes worried about announcing ourselves as Americans in this strange time of tense relationship between our two countries.

The AirBnB at which we're staying is a charming century-old converted church. Built by Unitarians, it was used by Presbyterians, held yoga classes, used as a performance and meeting space, as well as a recent worship space by folks in the Anglican Church of Canada. We're also within walking distance of a number of Anglican churches, from small village spaces like St. Barnabas (similar to St. John's here in Honeoye Falls) to Christ Church Cathedral or St. John the Divine – massive structures of stone, wood, and brick.

As I write this, I hope to visit some of the churches, maybe even for a worship service, and I brought along my Anglican Church of Canada Book of Common Prayer. The wonderful thing about being part of the global Anglican Communion is that it is at the same time diverse and familiar. In Canada, the head priest is often referred to as the Incumbent, rather than the Rector. The language of the Eucharist is almost identical to ours, with just a few differences. Some churches celebrate in a High Anglo-Catholic style with much more pomp and circumstance than we're used to, and others very casual with no pews, but chairs, and guitars and banjos. Diverse and familiar.


The Anglican Communion is a relationship of about 47 churches around the world all finding their roots in the ancient Church of England. The British Empire, in its global expansion and colonialism, brought its Church to most parts of this planet and all are now separate and autonomous with loving bonds back to the Mother Church. We pray for these different churches each Sunday as part of the Anglican Cycle of Prayer – from The Church of Nigeria to the Church in Hong Kong. From the Church of Bangladesh to the Church in Wales. All these churches have their own dioceses, bishops, priests, deacons, worshipers, and Prayer Books, hence the term Common.

We are part of The Episcopal Church (formerly named the Protestant Episcopal Church of the Domestic and Missionary Society of the United States of America – whew), and I’m so glad we shortened the name. We have 108 dioceses, each with a bishop and some with assisting bishops – 96 dioceses in the US proper, 10 dioceses in other countries and territories, and then a diocese in Europe, and a Federal and Armed Forces diocese. The Diocese of Rochester is one of those 108, with one bishop and 45 congregations.

Although the roughly 85-110,000,000 Anglican members on the planet have fellowship bonds with one another, the Church is in full communion with other denominations, too. This means that, for instance, an Episcopal priest in the US can serve at the altar or lead a congregation in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, or the other way around. The Episcopal Church, for instance, is also in full communion with the Moravian Church and the Church of Sweden, among others, and a plan has been approved for that same relationship with the United Methodist Church, pending a vote in 2027.

These are just some of the ways that I see the love of Christ, the philia of Christ – brotherly or affectionate love – binding us one to another so that we are all siblings in God’s eyes, as God empowers us to spread the agape of Jesus Christ – selfless and unconditional love – to each and every human being we meet.
