#### **RECTOR'S REFLECTION**

Recently, the Vestry of St. John's engaged with the Diocesan Director of Ministry to begin exploration and conversation of the Mission and Vision of this parish to prayerfully discern statements of these tasks, and to acknowledge and live them out as we carry out the Good News of God's Kingdom here in Honeoye Falls and beyond. The congregation is now part of that journey alongside members of the Vestry.

Some parishes wonder if they should even have statements of this sort. Valid question. If we look at page 855 in the Book of Common Prayer, part of The Catechism, we have our mission statement clearly stated, "The mission of the Church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ ... as it prays and worships, proclaims the Gospel, and promotes justice, peace, and love ... through the ministry of all its members." This seems rather succinct and to the point, and it is. Yet, part of the work of individual congregations is to look at the immediate community around them to see its role in and how carry this out. This is what the Vestry will continue this month as they pray and discern our part in God's work.

Once we can articulate a mission and vision, it truly helps this parish with our own marching orders, as well as how to communicate it to the community. It is with the community which we will not only partner in spiritual and prayerful work but also invite to be a part of a capital campaign to enhance our Parish House and Sanctuary. Pray for the Church, and for the church.

Since I've been serving here at St. John's, I've officiated at two funeral services of beloved members. This is part of the pastoral responsibility of every parish priest, and the Rite of Anointing, or Unction, is considered sacramental. A couple things that aren't often discussed when we approach end of life circumstances – planning your burial or funeral service, and planned giving.

While I plan and discuss services with family members after their loved one has died, it's a much greater gift to have it pre-planned with your wishes known. Many of our parishioners here at St. John's have done just that and the plans are on file in the church office. If you'd like to receive the forms for that and/or chat with me about it, please let me know.

One of the growing edges of clergy formation and education, I've found, is

that of asking folks for financial gifts. After 15 years in public radio before seminary, I feel I have the fund-drive material down pat, which I enjoy. It's the planned-giving and campaign-asking that a bit rusty. Our treasurer reminded me that, after one of our congregants died earlier this year, a hole in our budget was made obvious. There are only a few ways to fix that - raise more money during stewardship season, or/and ask folks to include St. John's as part of their planned giving - in their wills. I hope to have a quest speaker at Coffee Hour within the next few months to engage us all with both of those topics - topics to keep close to our hearts as loving communities of faith always must look forward continue the prayerful and faithful work of St. John's, part of the Body of Christ, here in Honeoye Falls.
