#### RECTOR'S REFLECTION

#### FR. JIM TRIMBLE

Recently, I did some engagement with my Big Box of Memories. I've carried this box with me, in one form or another, since high school. Loose pictures, ticket stubs, birthday cards, parents' jewelry, college ID, friendship bracelets, pocket calendars, grade school art projects. Remembering particular times, places, people, and relationships.

Remembering is an important part of being human. When we recall our past, or read about others' pasts, we can catch a glimpse of how the present came to be and can more fully make decisions for the future. Remembering camp dances, my brother's wrestling matches, my parents dancing in the living room to Glenn Miller, swiping on the online dating app when I saw Nancy's picture.

I remember the first time I drove the wrong way down a one-way street – 4:00am on my work to work at a radio station when two vehicles started driving toward me. That taught me to be more aware of my surroundings and take proper actions to not let that happen again. I won't even talk about the first time I hit a deer. We are about to hit the 5-year anniversary of the January 6<sup>th</sup> insurrection at our nation's capital – let's hope we all can remember the carnage and chaos of that event, what led up to it, what came after it, and never allow that to happen again.

When we celebrate the Holy Eucharist, we are called by Jesus to remember. "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." The Christmas season ends with Epiphany, a feast day in which the early church celebrated Jesus' brilliant manifestation (epiphaneia in Greek, also translated as "appearing") not only to the Magi but also to the world through his birth, baptism, and first recorded miracle at the wedding at Cana. Eastern Christianity maintains this multifaceted celebration of Epiphany, while we in the West focus primarily on remembering and celebrating the arrival of the Magi, those mysterious and devoted Wise Men who traveled far to welcome the Christ and offer their gifts. This a good time to ponder where we are in our journey. As we cross into the coming year, where do you find yourself on the path? Have you been traveling more by intention or by reacting to what's come your way? What direction do you feel drawn to go in during the coming weeks and months? Is there anything you need to let go of—or to find—in order to take the next step? In the coming months, what gift do you most need to offer, that only you can give?
